1. Fair Cake

**APPLE CREAM COFFEE CAKE**  
1/2 c. butter, softened  
1 1/2 c. sugar  
2 eggs  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
2 c. all-purpose flour  
1 tsp. baking powder  
1/2 tsp. baking soda  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1 c. (8 oz.) sour cream  
1/2 c. chopped walnuts  
2 tsp. ground cinnamon  
1 medium apple, peeled & thinly sliced

Directions: In a large bowl, cream butter and 1 cup sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Blend in vanilla. Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt; adding to creamed mixture alternately with sour cream, beating well after each addition. In a small bowl, combine the nuts, cinnamon and remaining sugar.

Spread half of the batter in a well-greased 10" tube pan with a removable bottom. Top with apples slices; sprinkle with half of the nut mixture. Top with remaining batter, then with remaining nut mixture.

Bake at 375 degrees for 40-45 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool in pan for 30 minutes. Carefully run a knife around edge of pan to loosen. Lift cake with removable bottom from pan. Cool completely. Before serving, carefully lift cake from pan bottom. Yield 12- 16 servings.

#### Fleece Competition

The purpose of this exhibit is to encourage the production of better wool and its proper preparation for market and/or hand spinning, and to show the best quality fleeces of the different breeds. The judging is based on these merits.

Fleece must have been shorn in the last 12 months from an animal owned by exhibitor, skirted and tied with paper twine. Fleece must be tagged with a 3x5 index card stating the breed of sheep.

Handspun yarn (any fiber) must be in skeins of two ounces (1 ½ ounces for specialty yarns --- silk, angora, cashmere, etc). A 3x5 index card must be attached to yarn stating fiber content and intended usage.

Articles must be spun and made by the same person. Technique (s) used may be weaving, knitting, crocheting, hooking, or embroidery. A 3x5 index card must be attached stating fiber content and explaining the technique used in spinning and making the article.
